


## SCHOOLS

- Strong schools will continue to drive residential demand




## FIRE PROTECTION

### WATER

- The Catawaba River and Lake Wylie are the County's primary water sources.
- The Rock Hill water plant has 36 MGD capacity, expanding to 48 MGD.
- Rock Hill provides water to Town of Fort Mill, City of York and York County. Tega Cay purchases water from Fort Mill.
- Gastonia provides water to Clover.
- The City of York will abandon their water treatment plant in 2017 and buy solely from Rock Hill.

### SEWER

- The Rock Hill Wastewater Treatment Plant (WTP), located on the Catawba River, serves Rock Hill and York County.
- The Fort Mill WTP currently has a capacity of 3 MGD, expanding to 12 MGD. The current usage is 1 MGD.
- The City of York WTP has a current capacity of 3 MGD and current usage of 1.2 MGD.
- Clover contracts with Gastonia.

- This policy helps to keep utility costs down and protects farmland and the rural character of York County.
